
Our History on the River

New Smyrna Beach occupies a notable place in history as the site of the largest colonial settlement in the United States. Settled in 1768 by Scottish physician Dr. Andrew Turnbull, it was named after the birthplace of his wife in Asia Minor which is now known as Smyrna, Turkey.

The history of Canal Street began at the same time when Dr. Turnbull established a series of canals for irrigation, drainage, and transportation. Two and a half centuries ago, flat bottomed boats glided up and down what is now Canal Street to deliver goods from the mainland to the Indian River. New Smyrna Beach soon established itself as an important producer of cane sugar and indigo.


